

Dumpy's Tip of the Month

Autumn recycling tips:

1/ compost fallen leaves and organic yard waste to enrich your soil and reduce waste, rather than sending them to a landfill.

2/ recycle packaging by breaking down cardboard boxes and removing any non-recyclable elements, and consider using materials like plastic bottles and aluminum cans for fall crafts or decorations.

3/ It's recommended that you bring the thermostat down to 68 degrees while you're at home during the fall season.

4/ With season changes and fluctuating warmth, there's no better time than to give your fireplace a good cleaning before heavy use.
